

UNITING CHURCH STATEMENT ON CLIMATE CHANGE

We believe that God's will for the earth is renewal and reconciliation, not destruction by human beings. The UCA regards climate change as a serious threat to the future and integrity of life on earth and is particularly concerned with the fate of some of our most vulnerable Pacific neighbours, including Fiji and Tuvolu. Our partner churches in the Pacific have called on us and churches throughout the world to act in solidarity to reduce the causes of climate change by ratifying the Kyoto Protocol, reducing energy use and developing clean, renewable energy sources.



Reflection

On Wednesday 13 year 8 students and their teacher from The Australian International Academy – Strathfield Campus, visited PM. They had taken up a collection and were delivering it to assist people through Meals Plus, Hope Hostel, Kelly's, TBC, Wesley Apartments, Youth services and Community Housing. The group came into the church and heard about the people who come to pray. Some are Hindu, or Jew, or Christian, others of no particular faith seeking somewhere to meditate. They heard about our annual interfaith peace service, as well as interfaith work with Muslims. Later they toured Meals Plus and visited the dining room where we hosted a group of Muslims for prayer, until they gained a mosque in Parramatta. The girls presented their gifts, and I asked them about the verses in the Koran that inspire them. They spoke of the verses that encourage Muslims to do good deeds for others.

The Meals Plus lunch the same day was sponsored by the Catholic Order of Sisters of Mercy, who have been in Parramatta since 1836. They also presented a cheque for \$10,000 for the work of Meals Plus, and spoke of their delight in working with Parramatta Mission of the Uniting Church, and the important role the UCA has in bringing people together. With everything prepared, the sisters served the meal in the hall. Two Muslim sisters who regularly volunteer in Meals Plus also assisted. The sight of the Sisters of Mercy, with a Muslim woman at either end of the table in the PM UCA Fellowship Hall serving meals to people who would otherwise go without seemed right.

I visited headspace at Penrith this week and heard about our work with young people aged 12-25. I heard about an innovative animal program for young people experiencing a range of life stressors including homelessness, trauma, anxiety, depression and psychosis. The manager, Daniel wrote:

In partnership with TAFE WSI and the RSPCA, we have taught young people about animal behaviour and how to support animals with mental illness and as a consequence they have learned more about their own experiences. Young People have learned that parrots in captivity can self-harm when distressed, that dogs and cats and horses can experience anxiety and depression and that many animals have difficult life histories

In the past few weeks, young people have read aloud to anxious dogs, they have built enrichment devices for self-harming parrots and most recently developed trust with horses. It was inspiring to see a number of participants develop trust in themselves and in the horses to perform a range of gymnastics on the back of a moving horse. To see them standing upright with an expression of pride and accomplishment in themselves and respect for their animal was breathtaking. The relationships that these young people have built with the animals and with each other have led to a growth in confidence for many in the group.

There is research evidence that human interaction with animals, the presence of animals and/or pet ownership can have a positive impact on physical health, such as lowering the heart rate and blood pressure or buffering against minor ailments (such as headaches). There is also evidence that human interaction with animals can have a positive impact on mental health, with research demonstrating the anxiety-reducing effects of animal petting, as well as the presence of dogs in alleviating distress in children. Such evidence underlies the utilisation of animals in a therapeutic setting.

The pilot program is facilitated by Daniel, Charlotte and Patrick at headspace Penrith and will end on the 22nd June with young people being taught animal massage and how to train dogs to enter water environments.

The Psalmist believed that when we do these sorts of works we are doing the works of God working through people.




