

GOSPEL: Mark 6:30-34, 53-56

30 The apostles assembled before Jesus and reported to him all that they did and taught. 31 And he said to them, "Come, privately by yourselves away into a desert place and rest a little." For many people were coming and going, and they had no opportunity to eat. 32 And they went away in the boat privately to a desert place. 33 Many saw them departing and knew and ran together from all the towns by land and came before them. 34 And going forth, Jesus saw a great crowd and he had much compassion for them, because they were as sheep without a shepherd. And he began to teach them much.

53 And crossing over to the land, they came to Gennesaret and anchored. 54 And when they stepped out of the boat immediately the people recognised him, 55 and ran round all that country and began to carry those who were ill on pallets to where they heard he was. 56 And wherever he entered into villages or into cities or into country, they laid their sick ones in the market places, and begged him that they might even touch the fringe of his clothes, and as many as touched him were healed. REFLECTIONS

currently reading a new book. It called is Christendom by Joshua Searle. It has a sub-title Forming Prophets for a Post-Christian World. Now there are one or two ideas that might need to be unpacked further before I proceed. Theology refers to how we talk about God. It is sometimes known as a discipline which is concerned with Faith seeking understanding. Christendom is a term that has been used to describe how a whole country, the continent, or civilization (read, Western civilization) was once most obviously committed to the Christian faith. In those days you could talk about Christian values and everyone in the given society seem to understand what was meant. It was almost assumed that if someone was a 'real Christian'. then they were caring and clearly practiced what they preached. Searle is one of those Christian thinkers that believes that that time has passed. Christendom has given way to a much more culturally and religiously diverse society; it is also one in which an increasing number of people profess no faith and indeed that has become normalized. We now live after Christendom and, as Searle suggests, in a post-Christian world.

By that latter turn of phrase he does not mean that there is no longer any place for Christian faith. Quite the reverse! What Searle is drawing attention to is people within the church what many struggling to understand. Rather than being at the centre of our wider society the Christian faith now finds itself moving towards the edge. Some of that shift is 'our' own fault. The church - and the credibility of the Christian faith - has suffered as a consequence of sexual misconduct by some and an inability to put into place processes that might protect vulnerable.

Searle knows all these things. He still wishes to talk about God, however. He still wishes to do theology. And he believes it is important for the proclaim good news, the Christian faith to gospel. One reasons that inspired his writing as a word taken from this morning's Gospel. Jesus looked upon the crowds with compassion (Fijian, lomani). He and love (kauwai). The Greek deep concern compassion is splagchizomai. It is the deepest emotion in the Greek language. Quite literally it means that one's bowels have been greatly moved which sounds very odd to us, but in the classical Greek world, the seat of the emotions was not your heart, but your bowels

Searle looks out at today's world of power politics, affluenza, and alternative facts in a post-truth society. He is not unaware of the plight of refugees and the dawning realities of climate change. Living 'after Christendom' can feel like the church is moving into a twilight period. and yet Searle writes ... when 'the darkness of night comes', then that night is also illuminated by stars and their light stands out all the more. One of those stars that might need to shine ever more brightly in our changing world is the practice of compassion. Instead of looking out on the world with fear and trepidation, with uncertainty and regret, why not 'imitate Christ' (as Paul would say). He looked out on the crowds and was filled with compassion.


