Ephesians 4:1-16

1 I, therefore a prisoner of the Lord, exhort you to walk a life worthy of the calling to which you were called, 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. 4 There is one body and one Spirit; just as you were called to the one hope of your calling; 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism; 6 one God and Father of all, the one who is over all and through all and in all. 7 But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of the gift of Christ. 8 Therefore it is said: "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to all people." 9 (Now in saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? 10 He who descended is he who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) 11 And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some shepherds and teachers. 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all arrive at the unity of faith and of the full knowledge of the Son of God, complete, to the stage at which we

(as a body) may possess in full the gifts of Christ, 14 in order that we may no longer be infants surging to and fro by waves and being blown around by every wind of teaching by the trickery of people, cunning in their methods of error, 15 rather, speaking the truth in love we may grow up in every way into him who is the head, Christ, 16 from whom the whole body is fitted together and joined together by means of every ligament with which it is supplied; when each part is working properly, makes for the body's growth for the building up of itself in love.

Reflections

Parts of Ephesians 4 seem to be an early church affirmation of faith, what sometimes might be called a creed. The word creed comes from the Latin and means "I believe." Below is the Nicene Creed, that the church approved in the year 381. Can you see the influences of Ephesians in the creed?

The Nicene Creed - English Language Liturgical Commission translation

We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God. light from light. true God from true God. begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Over the past two years the campaign OnePM has been a focus. The purpose has been to align the entirety of Parramatta Mission. People tell me there is less friction, greater collaboration and greater satisfaction. Even though there is more work to be done, much has been achieved. This work of structural realignment, is also aided by the way we treat each other. The writer of the letter to the church in Ephesus speaks of having the attribute of humility and treating each other with gentleness. The outcome of this is greater oneness.

The latest Engagement Day bus trip, here at Wesley Apartments. We are standing in front of the "redundant" water tank that was transformed into children's play equipment. One person on the tour had been at PM four days, another for five years.


